Four children were born to them, Conrad, who went to his grace in 1891, and Adam and Peter Griesheimer and Mrs. Edinger, who now reside in this city, and lovingly cared for their mother in her last days.

The deceased is a member of a prominent and influential German family, has lived an exemplary life, and one which won her the respect of all who knew her.
