

## A GOOD LIFE ENDED.

**Mrs Anna Margaret Griesheimer After  
a Brief Illness is Called to Her  
Long Home.**

After a good and useful life of more than three scores of years, Mrs. Anna Margaret Griesheimer passed away at 9:30 o'clock Saturday evening, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Tobias Edinger, of South Mulberry street, with whom she had made her home for the past fifteen years.

The deceased would have been eighty years old in another month. Her health has always been such that it was thought she would live to a remarkable age, but a few days ago she took ill, and in her advanced years could not successfully battle disease.

She was born in Lamperthelm, Hesse Darmstadt, Germany, in 1812, on the 6th of January. With her husband, Jacob Griesheimer, whose death occurred in 1874, emigrated to this country, coming direct to Chillicothe, where they arrived June 15, 1848, and have since lived.

Four children were born to them, Conrad, who went to his grace in 1891, and Adam and Peter Griesheimer and Mrs. Edinger, who now reside in this city, and lovingly cared for their mother in her last days.

The deceased is a member of a prominent and influential German family, has lived an exemplary life, and one which won her the respect of all who knew her. She was a consistent member of the German Evangelical church, whose pastor, Rev. Reinicke, officiated at her funeral, which took place from the home of her daughter, at two o'clock this afternoon. In accordance with wishes often expressed, her grandsons, Adam, Tobias, William, George, Edward and Albert Edinger acted as pall bearers. Interment was at Greenlawn cemetery.
